# Vision of the S.U.N. Initiative

# What the S.U.N. Project Is

Skydra's Unity Through Nourishment (S.U.N.) is a 12-month youth-led solidarity project funded by the European Solidarity Corps. It includes awareness campaigns, partnerships with local institutions, volunteer engagement, and a large community breadline event. By combining strategic planning and community participation, it addresses food insecurity on both practical and emotional levels.

# Understanding Food Insecurity in Skydra

Food insecurity is not only about lack of food, it is also about uncertainty, stress, isolation, and loss of dignity. Many families quietly struggle, reluctant to ask for help. Refugees often lack stable support systems, and homeless individuals face daily hardship. Rising living costs have pushed even previously stable households into vulnerability. These combined pressures create a growing humanitarian need within our community.





## The Breadline: Core Activity

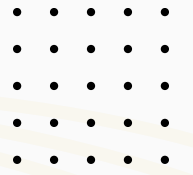
The breadline event will bring volunteers, community members, and beneficiaries together in a structured, welcoming environment. It provides warm, nutritious meals and ensures that individuals with special dietary requirements such as vegan or halal are also considered. More than a meal distribution, it serves as a community-building event that promotes empathy, dignity, and meaningful connection.

## Key Objectives of the Initiative

The S.U.N. Initiative seeks to reduce hunger by offering consistent and respectful food support, while simultaneously promoting solidarity and social awareness. We aim to bring together young people and older volunteers, encourage civic participation, strengthen community ties, and build a long-term movement centered on compassion, active citizenship, and social responsibility.

Your participation today reflects a shared vision of a Skydra where no one is left behind. Together, we can turn faith into action and action into lasting change.





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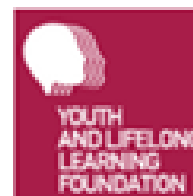
